What is Child Abuse?

Child abuse may include physical, sexual, or emotional abuse; neglect; or exploitation.

At Good Shepherd Primary School we are committed to keeping your child safe by:

- helping every pupil to develop strategies to keep themselves safe.
- ensuring that every member of staff is vetted.
- responding appropriately where any concerns are raised about a child.

Teachers and parents have responsibility for the welfare of the children in their care.

At times we may need to refer concerns to other agencies in the interests of the child.

It is important that you, as parents, are aware of these arrangements and know to inform the school of any concerns you may have about the safety of any child at Good Shepherd Primary School.

How can I report alleged abuse of a child?
